2007 Brings Model Dog Hobby.Com to the Net

The official launching of the new Modeldoghobby.com web site in December of 2006 will mean more exposure to the model dog hobby. The site offers Web pages for all the clubs that list their shows on Modeldogs @ Yahoogroups.

The site also offers information on model dog showing, judge's spotlights, articles and much more.

The new Hall of Fame for top winning model dogs has also been launched and has found a home on Modeldoghobby.com.

The new site has over 2 GZ of parking space and Unlimited bandwidth so the model dog online show should have no limit to the number of photos or the number of entrants.

The new PHP show program will also make it's debut in 2007. Entrants will now be able to upload their own images, make their own image overwrite

repairs and text repairs.

Each entrant will have their own image file folder in which to store their own images making the online model dog show easier with a more hands on experience for the entrant.



The IKC Dog Online Show has enlarged it's class list and the number of divisions making this the largest and most ambitious model dog online show on the internet. In 2006, IKC experienced a 300% increase in model dog online showers competing. The new program judges allow to write comments on each entry which can be either displayed to the public or only to the owner as per that owner's choice of setting the feature. Images will also increase in pixel size from 350 to 400 and up to 300 dpi .

HOW TO ENTER INFORMATION CONFORMATION SHOW:

Please pre-sort your entries by Group or Division, Use folders or plastic baggies. It is advised to put the total number of photos down so judges can be sure they get all your photos back to you Please include in your entry the following items. Photos presort by Conformation and Performance Shows, divisions and classes. Be Sure To Include LSASE with Adequate Postage! It is suggested that you use manilla or Priority mailers. Remember your SASE must be large enough to accommodate an 11 x 8-1/2; 20 or 30 page results. Judges may choose to email the results so it is suggested that you put loose stamps in your packet and not affix them to them the mailer. Postage Dues will be held until reimbursement is made!! The judge will mail out a post card notifying you of the postage owed or may choose to contact you via email if you have internet access, please help out by weighing your envelopes beforehand! Information either typed or printed Legibly on the back of the photo is required as follows The Entry's Name, Breed, Gender, Age, Mold Information (OF or CM/AR, etc) The Division Letter that photo goes in to; The Class Numbers. Any Description Additional Information such as breed registry if not AKC. The Entrant's Full Name AND Address

Optional information is suggested as follows: The neater your photo back, the less likely your photo may be mis-sorted or miss a class. You might try a small sticker that is the same for very one of your entries like a small flower, star, etc to help judges resort your photos. If you would like confirmation that your entry arrived to the Judge, we suggest including a self-addressed stamped post card with your entry if you don't have email. Otherwise place your email address in your entry packet or check the Model Dog Message Board for judge's updates to entries received.

HOW TO JUDGE CONFORMATION CLASSES

To begin judging you must judge the BREEDS. Go through the classes in numerical order of each breed listed. Sort all photos in each breed class by gender and age; adult dog, adult bitch, puppy dog, puppy bitch then judge classes. Classes should be placed first through fourth in adult dog, adult bitch, puppy dog & puppy bitch. Select one dog as BEST OF BREED (BOB) or BEST OF VARIETY (BOV) from the four first place winners; and one dog as BEST OF OPPOSITE SEX (BOS) from the other first place winners of the opposite sex from BOB. Depending on the number of dogs in the entry, you may also select a number of winners of AWARDS OF MERIT. Repeat this procedure for each breed. The "Others" class is also judged in the same manner. A puppy may be Best of Breed. *NOTE: The Others Classes are for all dogs both AKC registered not listed above and all dogs recognized by other sanctions or associations. After all breeds have been judged, (BOB) Best of Breed or (BOV) & Best of Variety 1st place winners will advance to the Group Competition. For the Group Competition the judge must place from each of the 9 Groups their choice for 1st thru 4th. These are be listed right after each Group Results in the Show (EX: Herding Group 1st - 2nd - 3rd - 4th) After judging the Wild Canine Group there should be now be Nine Group 1st Place Winners that advance into the final round of competition, BEST IN SHOW. These are then judged for the final single placing of BEST IN SHOW. At no time is gender to be considered as an award title. The Others Classes are for all dogs both AKC registered not listed above and all dogs recognized by other sanctions or associations. Other Classes are for breeds list in the Foundation Stock Service.

CONFORMATION TERMINOLOGY:

BEST OF BREED (BOB): The dog selected or the award made by a judge to that dog chosen as the best representative of the Breed. Similarly, Best of Variety (BOV) is the same award given to the best representative of a Variety exhibited that day (see VARIETY). In either case, those dogs selected BOB and those selected BOV each advance to their groups.

BEST OF OPPOSITE SEX (BOS) : The dog selected as the best in competition of the opposite sex of the BOB or BOV winner. This dog does not advance.

BEST OF VARIETY: A division of a breed based on coat, color, or size. For example, Dachshund (coat: smooth, longhaired, wirehaired); Collies (coat: Rough, Smooth), Labrador (color: yellow, chocolate, black) for IKC purposes required BOV judged classes are shown on the premium with a (v) after the first thru last class of that Variety.

AWARD OF MERIT: At the discretion of the judge, an additional award made to outstanding entries that are not judged to be either BOB/BOV or BOS. These AOM will earn the dog additional points and/or awards.

BEST IN SHOW (BIS): The award or the dog selected from among the seven finalists as the best dog among all entries.

Conformation Champion Title: 150 points in Conformation Classes. (CH placed in front of dog's name).

FREE SHOWS

Conformation Show to be held on the 10th of every other month beginning in January. Full results MUST be sent to the president and all entrants. Each show year goes from January until October. Judges should submit a phone number and email so they may be easily contacted if necessary. Results should be mailed out in timely manner. A three week turn around per show is suggested, but if you are running late, try to contact all members/president and send the pictures to the next judge at your expense. You will need to send each entrant a copy of your results, either hardcopy or email.

DISCLAIMER

IKC knows that some of the BOV titles cover breeds of dogs that do not typically split by colors or coat type. IKC does this not in error but to allow for some type of split in these classes to handle the larger numbers that typically enter in them. IKC makes an effort to list classes more closely to a real dog show. But does allow for some difference due to the artistic merit of showing, collecting original finish and the customizing of model dogs. In performance, IKC also allows for gender split in an effort to allow for a larger number of dogs to win awards even though in real dog shows, males and females show together.

Best of Breed: 6 points ; Best Opposite Sex: 5 points; Best of Variety: 6 points; Best of Division: 6 points; Award of Merit: 5 points; Best In Group: 10 points; Best In Show: 15 point

HOW TO ENTER INFORMATION CONFORMATION SHOW:

Please pre-sort your entries by Group or Division, Use folders or plastic baggies. It is advised to put the total number of photos down so judges can be sure they get all your photos back to you. Please include in your entry the following items. Photos presort by Conformation and Performance Shows, divisions and classes. Be Sure To Include LSASE with Adequate Postage! It is suggested that you use manilla or Priority mailers. Remember your SASE must be large enough to accommodate an 11 x 8-1/2; 20 or 30 page results. Judges may choose to email the results so it is suggested that you put loose stamps in your packet and not affix them to them the mailer. Postage Dues will be held until reimbursement is made!! The judge will mail out a post card notifying you of the postage owed or may choose to contact you via email if you have internet access, please help out by weighing your envelopes beforehand! Information either typed or printed Legibly on the back of the photo is required as follows The Entry's Name, Breed, Gender, Age, Mold Information (OF or CM/AR, etc) The Division Letter that photo goes in to; The Class Numbers. Any Description Additional Information such as breed registry if not AKC. The Entrant's Full Name AND Address

Optional information is suggested as follows: The neater your photo back, the less likely your photo may be mis-sorted or miss a class. You might try a small sticker that is the same for very one of your entries like a small flower, star, etc to help judges resort your photos. If you would like confirmation that your entry arrived to the Judge, we suggest including a self-addressed stamped post card with your entry if you don't have email. Otherwise place your email address in your entry packet or check the Model Dog Message Board for judge's updates to entries received.

PERFORMANCE CLASSES OVERVIEW:

Each class must be split by gender and all classes are placed 1st through 4th. Take each division and choose a BID (Best in Division - 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th) All BID 1st winners advance to TIP Awards - TOP PERFORMANCE DOG, TOP PERFORMANCE BITCH, TOP PERFORMANCE TEAM, TOP ACTIVITY PUPPY & TOP WILD CANINE ACTIVITY. These titles will then advance to the BIP Award (Best in Performance) TIP are also placed 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th. From TIP 1st place winners the judge will place one dog BIP. *No puppies may show in any classes except for Puppy Activity Division. Wild Canine may not show in any other division but Wild Canine. Any dogs entered as a team must appear the same photo

Performance classes are judged using AKC guidelines – if you are showing under another organization's rules, reference the organization and define the event. Although in the real dog world genders are not divided in IKC dogs are divided by adult dog and adult bitch in all divisions. This is to allow for more chances of awards and titles to be earned as our hobby grows. Puppies allowed only in Puppy Activities Division only.

Performance classes are judged on 1) correct, qualifying performance according to the rules and regulations of the stated event, 2) realistic footing, background, and equipment, 3) realistic dog, 4) presentation (dog and props in the proper position for the class), and 5) photo quality. Each class is placed 1st through 4th. The Best Dog in each performance division is chosen, and an overall Best in Performance is selected from the division winners.

Explanation of your dog's performance is not required but is strongly encouraged. Otherwise the judge will be forced to guess as to what your dog is supposed to be doing. Basic props and/or equipment are required in most all of the performance classes. A suitable collar, for example, is mandatory in Canine Good Citizen, Rally, and Obedience classes. It is advised to make reference dog's collar is obscured by long hair around the neck. Suitable collars are optional in AKC agility, but proper obstacles or equipment are necessary in depicting agility scenes. Suitable collars are the types of collars allowed in the regulations.

Handlers, judges, ring stewards, prop dogs, ring equipment, etc. may be helpful in many classes but are not necessarily required (again, check the regulations of the event you are entering).

It is suggested that you reference and document all "Other" performance classes.

PERFORMANCE CLASS DESCRIPTIONS:

Canine Good Citizen Division

Canine Good Citizen are not competitions, but pass/fail tests. They have some things that are not included in the other events like accepting a stranger, being groomed, behaving around another dog, etc. The exercises are performed with the dog on leash wearing either a flat buckled collar or a slip training collar, no pinch collars or gentle leaders are allowed. At no time can the dog show any aggression toward the owner or evaluators and must be under control (no jumping up or pulling on the leash).

Rally - O Division

All dogs shall be shown in a flat buckle or snap collar, plain harness, or properly fitted martingale (limited slip) collar. No choke collars, prong collars, shock collars, no-pull harnesses, martingale leads, or head collars are allowed. Rally - O is judged under AKC standard.

Dog Obedience Leash, Collar and Other Rules for Novice, Open and Utility

SECTION 16 Use of Leash - All dogs shall be kept on leash except when in the obedience ring or exercise ring. Dogs should be brought into the ring and taken out of the ring on leash. Dogs may be kept on leash in the ring when brought in to receive awards, and when waiting in the ring before and after the Group exercises. The leash shall be left on the judge's table or other designated place, between the individual exercises, and during all exercises except the Heel on Leash and Group exercises. The leash must be

of fabric or leather and, in the Novice classes, need be only of sufficient length to provide adequate slack in the Heel on Leash exercise.

SECTION 17 Collars - Dogs in the obedience ring must wear a collar. ; The collar may be of a buckle, slip or martingale type. Buckle collars with the buckle made of metal or plastic with or without a tongue must be used. Slip collars of an appropriate single length of leather, fabric or chain with two (2) rings, one (1) on each end are acceptable. Martingale collars may be of any combination of chain, fabric or leather. Collars made of leather, fabric or chain, may be of any color, decorations may be stamped into the leather or fabric. ; Dog's name and/or title may not be on the collar. Special training collars (prong or spikes on the inside or outside, electronic collars) or collars that are either too tight or so large that they hang down unreasonably in front of the dogs, are not permitted. There shall not be anything hanging from the collars.

SECTION 18 Heel Position - The Heel position as used in these Regulations, whether the dog is sitting, standing, lying down, or moving at heel, means that the dog shall be straight in line with the direction in which the handler is facing, at the side of the handler's left leg without crowding, permitting the handler freedom of motion at all times. The area from the dog's head to shoulder shall be in line with the handler's left hip.

SECTION 19 Hands - In all exercises in which a dog is required to heel on-lead, one of the options below shall be followed: (1) The handler's arms and hands shall move naturally at their sides while in motion, with the leash held in the left hand, or (2) the hand (s) holding the leash will be held against, and centered in the front of the body, in the area of the waist. The forearm(s) shall be carried, as much as possible, against the body. In either of the above situations, the hands and arms may be adjusted during the fast portion of the exercise, in order to maintain balance. Hand position, other than during the fast, must remain constant during the heeling exercise, except if a hand signal is used to begin heeling. In that case, an acceptable hand gesture is allowed instead of a verbal command. After the hand gesture is made, the hand must return to one of the acceptable positions. There shall be a minor to substantial deduction if the hands and arms are not carried in one of the positions state above. In all exercises in which the dog is required to Come to or Return to the handler and Sit in Front, the handler's arms and hands shall hang naturally at his sides while the dog is coming in and until the dog has sat in front. A substantial deduction shall be made if a handler's arms and hands are not hanging naturally at his sides while the dog is coming in and until the dog has sat in front.

SECTION 20 Commands and Signals - Whenever a command or signal is mentioned in these Rules & Regulations, a single command or signal only may be given by the handler and any extra commands or signals must be penalized; except that whenever the Rules & Regulations specify "command and/or signal" the handler may give either one (1) or the other or both command and signal simultaneously. When a signal is permitted and given, it must be a single gesture with one (1) arm and hand only, and the arm must immediately be returned to a natural position. Delay in following a judge's order to give a command or signal must be penalized, unless the delay is directed by the judge because of some distraction or interference. Signaling correction to a dog is forbidden and must be penalized. Signals must be inaudible and the handler must not touch the dog. Any unusual noise or motion may be considered to be a signal. Position of the arms and hands and movements of the body that aid the dog shall be considered additional signals except that a handler may bend the body and knees as far as necessary to bring his hand on a level with the dog's eyes in giving a signal to a dog in the Heel position, and that in the Directed Retrieve exercise the body and knees may be bent to the extent necessary to give the direction to the dog. Whistling or the use of a whistle is prohibited. The dog's name may be used once immediately before any verbal command or before a verbal command and signal when these Regulations permit command and/or signal. The name shall not be used with any signal not given simultaneously with a verbal command. The dog's name, when given immediately before a verbal command, shall not be considered as an additional command, but a dog that responds to its name without waiting for the verbal command shall be scored as having anticipated the command. The dog should never anticipate the handler's directions, but must wait for the appropriate commands and/or signals.

Obedience Novice Division:

Open to all dogs over 6 months old - CD title awarded when dog has earned 50 points amount of points in any of the Novice Obedience. In Figure 8 entrant should note that either Two People or Two Cones are required by the rules but the photo angle can depict only one cone or one person and still be a legal entry.

Obedience Open Division:

Prerequisite: CD title. The CDX title will be awarded when dog has earned 150 of points in any of the Open Obedience classes. In Figure 8 entrant should note that either Two People or Two Cones are required by the rules but the photo angle can depict only one cone or one person and still be a legal entry.

Obedience Utility Division:

Prerequisite: CDX title. The UD title would be awarded when dog has earned 150 points in any of the Utility classes.

Tracking Division:

Tracking is a part of police, military, and search and rescue work. It is also a competitive sport on its own, with all breeds able to participate. Dogs entered in Tracking classes must have correct harness and leash. Background and footing, tracking flags, handler, judge, and/or articles may be helpful but are not required. Dogs earn points separate from the Performance Championship Title. A TD Title requires 50 points. Upon earning 50 points a TD title maybe added to your photo back and a certificate will be mailed out to you.

Agility Division:

All Agility Classes are judged under 3 major agility organizations: AKC, USDAA, and NADAC. Agility entries require an agility obstacle. AKC allows collars at the discretion of the entrant. If you are showing in other organizations (such as USDAA, NADAC, or UKC), be sure to check the organizations' rules for specific regulations on collars, obstacles, etc. USDAA and NADAC let any dog compete regardless of pedigree. The basic rules and equipment for each are similar. USDAA & NADAC prohibit collars, AN - Agility Novice title awarded when dog has earned 50 points amount of points in any of the Novice. AI - Agility Intermediate title will be awarded when dog has earned 100 of points in any of the Open Agility classes. AA - Agility Advanced - title will be awarded when dog has earned 150 of points in any of the Open Agility classes. ACH - Agility Champion title will be awarded when dog has earned 150 of points in any of the Open Agility classes.

Basic Obedience Division :

Most of the classes are self explanatory. Breed Conformation or Handling (Showmanship) Class - At real dog shows, they have Handling classes for Juniors that are basically like a showmanship class at a horse show. Entries are required to have a handler doll and need the correct set-up not just a dog standing there. Collar and leash required as well.

Companion Dog Division:

Childhood Companion or Lap Dog - Self-explanatory, but needs people in picture.

Companion Service - Dogs helping with chores around the house. Pick up laundry, trash, bring you a beer or soda, turn out the lights; now your dog gets to earn his biscuit.

Backpacking - Hiking with your dog in a leisure activity.

Historical Task or Event - Salukis laying around with King Tut, Mastiffs guarding Caesar, Irish Wolfhounds hunting wolves, Chows & Pekinese hanging out in the Forbidden City, Malamutes mushing the mail to Anchorage, generic dogs camped out with the Plains tribes, etc.

Movie, Television, Circus, or Other Stage Performance - Your dog stands in as Toto, Lassie, Rin Tin Tin, Eddie, or dresses up and does circus tricks.

Realistic Tricks and Games - Dog must be shown playing with a prop or "doing" a trick, such as shaking hands, etc.

Service & Working Dog Division:

Guard or Police or Military Dog - For dogs actually working for the police or military. Judged under DVG Rules. Must show an eager, intelligent readiness. The correct props are required.

Seeing Eye/Hearing/Therapy/Service - Must have a harness, appropriate props, or be shown assisting a handicapped person.

Search and Rescue - Judged under DVG Rules. Dog must display an active/searching attitude. Outdoor background in rough terrain with props.

Schutzhund or Ring Sport - **Schutzhund** (translates as protection dog) is a sport popular in Europe and the US. The breed registries for some of the working dogs in Europe will not let you breed a dog unless it has a working title, and the most common one is the Schutzhund. It consists of a tracking test, obedience test, and protection test all in one day, a three-event-day if you will. Ring sport has similar exercises, except they do not require tracking. Dogs could be doing any of the exercises of the sport.

Fun & Sport Division:

Frisbee or Flyball or Scent Hurdles - judged on rules for North American Flyball Association. International Disc Dog Handlers' Association (IDDHA)

Water Competitions - **Dock Diving, Aqua Launch, Water Rescue, Boat/Net Work** - As seen on TV, Dock Diving is becoming a popular event. ;There are also tests for dogs to do water work that they are bred for. Newfoundlands have water rescue tests, and Portuguese Water Dogs were bred to help fishermen string nets between boats and set out buoys.

Transporting - **Sledding, Carting, and Weight-Pulling** are specific transportation activities. Carting competitions have tests similar to some of the driving events for horses.

Musical Freestyle - **Dressage** has musical freestyle, and so do dogs. Handlers dress in costume (and sometimes the dogs too) and do a routine to music with a theme. ;Example: Hat and tails on the handler with bow tie on the dog dancing to New York, New York.

Racing - **Calcutta** style races seen at fairgrounds and fun shows open to all breeds such as Jack Russel or Border Collies. Entries race usually a straight line from one handler to the second handler with their favorite toy or treat as the prize.

Stock & Ranch Work Division:

Livestock Guardian - Must be shown guarding a flock, stock, or herd of animals, poultry, etc.

Herding Division

Herding - Must show a herding attitude, pose or capability. Outdoor pix with animals required. AKC rule takes precedence with any herding breed association as a secondary rule. Dogs competing in herding will also receive a separate title awards: HS Herding-Started Level (50 points), HI Herding-Intermediate Level - (100 points), HX Herding-Advanced Level - (150 points) and for Herding Champion: HCH (250 points) Upon completing each level you may add these letters to your photo back with HCH in front of the name.

Hunting Division :

Sporting dogs are those that hunt birds: setters, pointers, spaniels, retrievers. Also known as Gun Dogs. Scent hounds and terriers hunt game that is usually considered varmints: Fox, rats, mice, raccoons, rabbits, otters, etc. They find game by using their nose, and either tree the game, or go to ground. This group includes Foxhounds, Coonhounds, Beagles, Harriers, Bassett Hounds, Otter Hounds, as well as most of the tougher terriers such as Jack (Parson) Russells, Cairns, Border Terriers, etc. Sight hounds hunt by using their keen vision and great speed. Afghans, Salukis, Whippets, Greyhounds, belong in this group. Field backgrounds and correct equipment are required in these classes.

How to Earn Title Achievements:

Dogs achieving these titles will earn the right to add those titles to their name.

Performance Champion Title:

50 points in Performance Classes (PCH) placed in back of name.
